BARBARA BUSH HOUSTON LITERACY FOUNDATION ANNOUNCES AUTHOR LINEUP FOR 29TH ANNUAL *A CELEBRATION OF READING*

Annual event to take place Thursday, April 20 featuring a lineup of prominent authors

HOUSTON – The Barbara Bush Houston Literacy Foundation (Foundation) is pleased to announce that its 29th annual *A Celebration of Reading* will take place Thursday, April 20 at The Hobby Center for the Performing Arts. The annual signature event hosted by Neil and Maria Bush, co-founders of the Foundation, will feature a notable lineup of bestselling authors and shine light on the importance of reading in our community. This year's event will also commemorate the 10th anniversary of the Barbara Bush Houston Literacy Foundation.

"My wife, Maria, and I are honored to present the 29th annual *A Celebration of Reading* this year featuring inspiring authors," said Neil Bush. "Mom created this event to demonstrate the transformative power of reading and to call upon the Houston community to give in support of literacy programs that empower more children and adults with the skills and tools they need to reach their full potential in life and position our city to thrive socially and economically."

The 2023 author lineup includes:

- Nelson DeMille, a former U.S. Army lieutenant and decorated Vietnam Veteran, and seven-time #1 New York Times bestselling author. He has written 22 novels, 16 of which made the New York Times bestsellers' list. His book, The General's Daughter was made into a major motion picture, and two of his books, Word of Honor, and Mayday, have been adapted to television. DeMille will share thoughts about his work and most recent book, The Maze, the eighth in a series featuring NYPD Homicide Detective John Corey who readers first met in Plum Island.
- Tess Gerritsen, an international and *New York Times* bestselling author of 30 books, most notably her crime and medical thrillers. Her Rizzoli & Isles series of novels featuring homicide detective Jane Rizzoli and medical examiner Maura Isles inspired the TNT television series "Rizzoli & Isles." She will speak about her most recent book, *Listen to Me*, a fast-paced, harrowing thriller of a brutal investigation with dire consequences.
- **Rev. Dr. Russell J. Levenson, Jr.** has been an ordained Episcopal Church Minister for over 30 years and served as Rector of St. Martin's in Houston, Texas the largest Episcopal Church in North America for more than 15 years. He will share insight into his book, *Witness to Dignity: The Life and Faith of George H.W. and Barbara Bush*, which highlights the Bushes' wit and wisdom, commitment to faith, family, and friends, and their tireless desire to bless the lives of others.



- Tom Papa, a stand-up comedian and writer, is one of the top comedic voices in the country finding success in film, TV, radio, and podcasts, as well as on the live stage. A frequent panelist on NPR's Wait Wait Don't Tell Me and other shows, Tom has written three books and will discuss his most recent, You're Doing Great!: And Other Reasons To Stay Alive, a collection of essays on how people really live in modern America and what's truly good and wonderful about our lives. He has also penned We're All In This Together, set for release in June.
- **Isabel Wilkerson** has become a leading figure in narrative nonfiction, bringing the invisible and marginalized into the light and into our hearts, and is the recipient of a number of awards. She is a National Humanities Medal recipient and during her tenure as Chicago Bureau Chief of The New York Times, became the first African American woman to win the Pulitzer Prize in journalism. She will share her most recent bestselling book, *Caste: The Origins of our Discontents*, which invites us to discover the inner workings of an American hierarchy that goes beyond the confines of race, class, or gender.

Proceeds from A Celebration of Reading advance the mission of former First Lady Barbara Bush's legacy championed by the Barbara Bush Houston Literacy Foundation, as well as national efforts through the Barbara Bush Foundation for Family Literacy of helping more children and adults realize their fullest potential in life and live the American Dream by learning how to read.
