BARBARA BUSH HOUSTON LITERACY FOUNDATION ANNOUNCES AUTHORS FOR 30TH ANNUAL A CELEBRATION OF READING

Event to take place Tuesday, April 9 shining light on First Lady Barbara Bush's literacy cause

HOUSTON – The Barbara Bush Houston Literacy Foundation (Foundation) is pleased to reveal their full lineup of five prominent, bestselling authors for the 30th annual *A Celebration of Reading*, which will take place Tuesday, April 9, 2024 at The Hobby Center for the Performing Arts. The annual signature event is chaired by the organization's co-founders, Neil and Maria Bush. Children and grandchildren of President George H.W. Bush and First Lady Barbara Bush to serve as honorary co-chairs. All proceeds from *A Celebration of Reading* advance the Barbara Bush Houston Literacy Foundation's mission of improving lives through the power of literacy.

"Mom designed this event 30 years ago to shine the light on her cause of literacy and demonstrate to everyone that reading is joyful and a foundational skill for living the American Dream," said Neil Bush. "My wife, Maria, and I are deeply committed to carrying forth Mom's literacy legacy and my parent's longstanding commitment to the people of Houston, the city they called 'home' for more than five decades. The 2024 *A Celebration of Reading* will be an inspiring milestone event and a platform during which we will commemorate Dad's 100th birthday."

The official 2024 author lineup is:

- **Jean Becker,** who served as chief of staff for President George H.W. Bush for nearly twenty-five years. She is the editor of *Pearls of Wisdom* by Barbara Bush and author of the *New York Times* bestseller *The Man I Knew: The Amazing Story of George H.W. Bush's Post Presidency*. Becker's next book, *Character Matters: And Other Life Lessons from George H.W. Bush,* is set for release in April 2024. Prior to her post as chief of staff, Becker served as deputy press secretary to First Lady Barbara Bush and was a newspaper reporter for 10 years, including a four-year stint at *USA TODAY*.
- Chris Bohjalian, the #1 New York Times bestselling author of twenty-four books, including The Lioness, Hour of the Witch, Midwives, and The Flight Attendant, which has been made into a MAX limited series starring Kaley Cuoco. His other books include The Red Lotus, The Guest Room; Close Your Eyes, Hold Hands; The Sandcastle Girls; Skeletons at the Feast; and The Double Bind. His novels Secrets of Eden, Midwives, and Past the Bleachers were made into movies, and his work has been translated into more than thirty- five languages. Bohjalian is set to release his next book, called The Princess of Las Vegas, in March 2024.



- Gary Gulman is one of the most popular touring comics, selling out venues nationwide including Carnegie Hall. He is one of a select few comics to guest on every major late-night comedy program. Gulman's five comedy specials include HBO's *The Great Depresh*, a highly acclaimed look at mental illness and his new special, *Gary Gulman: Born on Third Base* which releases on MAX December 21st. In his latest special, Gulman hilariously chronicles his impoverished childhood on food stamps, free lunch and welfare checks while skewering our current Tale of Two Cities-esque wealth gap. In 2019 he appeared in the international blockbuster *Joker*, and he has a recurring role on the Hulu comedy series *Life & Beth*. A product of Boston, Gulman was previously a scholarship college football player, an accountant, and a high-school teacher. *Misfit: Growing up Awkward in the 80's* was released in September 2023 and is his first book.
- Brad Taylor is a New York Times bestselling author of 18 books and former special forces officer. He is most popularly known for his Pike Logan series, including American Traitor, End of Days, and The Devil's Ransom. Dead Man's Hand, released in 2024, is a gripping thriller in which Pike Logan goes head-to-head with Vladimir Putin. Brad retired from the U.S. Army Infantry and Special Forces as a Lieutenant Colonel after 21 years of service, including eight years with the 1st Special Forces Operational Detachment Delta, commonly known as Delta Force. He served in Operation Enduring Freedom and Operation Iraqi Freedom and as assistant professor of military science at The Citadel. Brad now consults on asymmetric threats for various agencies.
- James McBride is an award-winning, New York Times bestselling author of eight books including Miracle at St. Anna, Song Yet Sung, Oprah's Book Club selection Deacon King Kong, and, most recently, The Heaven & Earth Grocery Store. His landmark memoir, The Color of Water, spent more than two years on the New York Times bestseller list and is considered an American classic. The Good Lord Bird won the National Book Award for Fiction. McBride has been a staff writer for The Boston Globe, People Magazine, and The Washington Post, and is an accomplished musician and screenwriter. A recipient of a National Humanities Medal, McBride is also a distinguished writer in residence at New York University.

Proceeds from *A Celebration of Reading* advance the mission of the late First Lady Barbara Bush's legacy championed by the Barbara Bush Houston Literacy Foundation, as well as national efforts through the Barbara Bush Foundation for Family Literacy of helping more children and adults realize their fullest potential in life and live the American Dream by learning how to read. Given the milestone 30th anniversary of the event, the Barbara Bush Houston Literacy Foundation set a goal to raise \$2 million.
